Post Secondary Information

The Class of 2009 indicated the following: 90% plan to enroll in either a 4-year or 2-year college, 4% will enroll in a vocational education program, 2% enlisted in the military and 4% chose other.

Points of Pride

- ◆ Marshall High School earned an EducationYes! grade of a B for the 2008 – 2009 school year.
- ◆ Marshall High School average ACT scores are higher or equal to the state average in the following ACT scored areas: reading, writing, English, English + writing.
- ◆ MHS students took advantage of advance placement coursework in the following areas of study: AP Statistics, AP Calculus, AP English and AP Biology. Of the 32 students who took the advanced placement tests in the Spring of 2009, 28 earned at least one score of three or higher, thus making them eligible for college course credit.
- ◆ The Class of 2009 for Marshall High School was offered in excess of \$1.2 million in scholarships and grants.

- ◆ There were 86 members of the Class of 2009 who earned initial qualifying scores for the \$4,000 Michigan Promise Scholarship based on their scores from the Michigan Merit Exam. Students who receive qualifying scores (Level 2 or above) in each of the required test components are eligible to receive up to half of their scholarship in the first two years of postsecondary enrollment (in installments of \$1,000 each year).
- ◆ Out of the 180 graduates of the Class of 2009, a total of 42% graduated with honors distinction. Specifically, 19% Highest Honors (3.75 GPA or greater), 14% High Honors (3.50 GPA or greater) and 9% Honors (3.25 GPA or greater).
- ◆ Two members of the Class of 2009 were named National Finalists and one member was named National semifinalist in the 2009 National Merit Scholarship Program participated by more than 1.5 million students who entered the 2009 competition by taking the PSAT.
- ◆ Academically, 59 MHS student-athletes earned all conference / division recognition during the 2008 - 2009 school year. Athletically, MHS students were successful in the following ways: District Championships were won by Boys and Girls basketball, Boys Soccer and Football; Regional finalist level was attained by Boys soccer and Football; the Boys and Girls golf teams were State qualifiers; and two athletes qualified for the State wrestling tournament.
- ◆ The Instrumental and Vocal music departments continued to receive top ratings in district and state competition.
